Each AGEP-NC Fellow develops a sensemaking initiative to engage faculty colleagues in sensemaking about the goals of the AGEP-NC project. The following was recently proposed by AGEP-NC Fellow Edmon Perkins (Mechanical and Aerospace Engineering, NC State).

Two virtual brown bag lunch events will be held several months apart to foster a discussion on the core values of the department. These events will be used to gauge the intrinsic core values of the faculty. Through the discussions and survey data, the department will begin to clarify its core values and how these core values affect the recruitment and retention of under-represented minority students. This information will be used to initiate substantive modifications to departmental policies to aid in recruitment and retention activities.
